The resulting publications became favorite selections in the libraries of many children, among them, future generations of Disney and Pixar artists who were inspired to draw, dream, and later, create their own films and Golden Books. *The Art of the Disney Golden Books* celebrates a legacy that has now thrived for more than eighty years and continues to influence new generations of artists and filmmakers. At the end of that initial run, Walt lost the contract to Oswald, which prompted the creation of Mickey Mouse.
