The book is full of energy of survival, sense of humour, courage, beauty and sadness, mountains, forests and ocean. The character of the author - desperate, crazy, mystical and romantic is a bit out of date. The hero still believes in miracles, the spiritual reality is in some cases much more felt than the normal life of a middle class burger. Rebellious, searching, joyful, crazy and immortal, the way of the main character is the lovely way of a hunter, looking for freedom and truth.
