Finally, the third essay describes a new method to analyze the profitability of different pricing schemes that explicitly accounts for the intertemporal nature of lottery games with rolling jackpots. Since period-by-period variation in sales induced by rolling jackpots causes changes in the probability that a jackpot is won, which in-turn influences the probability of reaching new drawings with higher jackpot amounts, static analysis of lottery profitability could lead to biased estimates of expected profit. By utilizing a Monte Carlo integration procedure, a measure of expected profit is obtained through the simulation of lottery play over a period of four years. Hypothetical policy changes are examined to estimate potential increases in profitability. Empirical results for the game, Lotto Texas, indicate that a \$0.40 increase in price would lead to an estimated increase in profit ranging from \$142 million to \$191 million over four years.
