Originally commissioned by New York State when EL Education went by the name Expeditionary Learning, the version of the ELA curriculum posted on New York's Engage NY website has been downloaded over 6 million times. This edition has been updated with alignment to nationwide Common Core standards, and has been adopted by schools and districts in 43 states + Washington, D.C. Grade 3: Module 3A focuses on a deep study of the classic tale *Peter Pan*. Students consider the guiding question: How do writers capture a reader's imagination? Students look at *Peter Pan* through the lens of a writer, examining author's craft, specifically the use of dialogue and vivid language. They then write their own imagined scene about *Peter Pan*. The end of the module shifts students' focus to consider how readers share their own opinions about a book, as they write an opinion piece about which character in *Peter Pan* most effectively captures their imagination and why.
