Lo stato di conservazione complessivo del rilievo era precario a causa della sconnessione centrale dei blocchi e dell'indebolimento del supporto ligneo dovuto a un massiccio attacco di insetti xilofagi. Nel corso di un intervento di manutenzione era stata fissata sotto la base, in modo approssimativo, una tavoletta sagomata con chiodi e colla per unire le parti che compongono la struttura del supporto ligneo. Inoltre sul retro, per rafforzare la giunzione, erano state fatte aderire due pezze di stoffa; nell'area limitrofa una mancanza del supporto era stata colmata con una vistosa stuccatura a base di gesso e colla. Le perdite di intaglio, per fortuna limitate, riguardano solo il corno del bue e dell'asino. Il degrado strutturale del retro della Natività si era ripercosso sul fronte dell'opera, in particolare sulla figura del Bambino e sulla cesta, con sollevamenti e mancanze degli strati preparatori e pittorici.
