This humorous book contains zany writing and illustrations used by Monty Python. Graham Chapman's education and vocational training occurred variously in such places as the Midlands, Eton, the University of Cambridge, St Swithin's Hospital, on tour in a revue with John Cleese in New Zealand and on the island of Ibiza with David Frost. He was the author of *A Liar's Autobiography* and he also wrote for Monty Python's *Flying Circus* and the TV show *Doctor in the House*. Graham Chapman died in 1989. John Cleese was educated at the University of Cambridge where he performed in *Footlights* and then went to work in London as a performer and as a comedy writer for the BBC. Besides his work with Python he is best known for his TV series *Fawlty Towers* (co-written with Connie Booth), the books he has written with psychologist Robin Skinner and films such as *Clockwise*, *A Fish Called Wanda* and *Fierce Creatures*.
